2. The Passover was a memorial commanded by God, in memory of and in thanksgiving for the deliverance of the Israelites from the slavery of Egypt. At that time, the angel of the Passover "passed over" the homes of the Israelites which were marked with the blood of the lamb that had been sacrificed.

3. The Passover lamb was a real sacrifice, a combination of the sin and peace offerings; similarly, our Lord died for us as a sin offering on the Cross, and gives Himself to us as a peace offering in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar.
